



## **Annual Governance Statement for Woodsetton Primary School 2020 – 2021**

In accordance with the Government's requirement for all governing bodies, the 3 core strategic functions of our Governing Body are:

1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos, values and strategic direction;
2. Holding the Head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils and for the effective and efficient performance management of staff;
3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

Our instrument of governance is comprised of the following categories:

- 5 co-opted governors
- The Headteacher

The Full Governing Body meets at least once each term, we also have committees to consider different aspects of the school in detail and other committees to carry out statutory functions. During 2021-22 these committees will be:

- School Improvement Committee
- Resources Committee
- Pay Committee
- Performance Review Panel
- Pupil Discipline Committee
- Appeals Committee.

The work that our governors have completed during last year (2020-21) includes:

- Deputy Headteacher appointment
- School budget monitoring
- Covid Catch up Premium/Pupil Premium /Sports Premium monitoring
- Covid 19 risk assessments, Health and Safety issues and building works monitored
- Scheduled policies and procedures updated and reviewed
- Staff recruitment/staff allocation monitoring
- Curriculum review – intent, implementation and impact monitored to ensure pupils develop their learning
- Data analysed to ensure that pupils make good progress from their starting points
- Attendance monitored and tracked
- Discussions with SLT and class teachers



Our Governing Body Action Plan for 2021-2022 hopes to achieve the following:

- Support the school to improve educational outcomes for all pupils
- Continue to develop a school curriculum that meets all of our pupils needs
- Ensure that extra classrooms are in place to accommodate additional pupils
- Further develop governor training and continue robust self-assessment
